



How can your school reduce food waste?



Introduction

Once you have carried out the BHee surveys to find out WHICH FOODS children are throwing away and the reasons WHY children are wasting food, it's time to interview the adults involved with school dinners to find out their views on food waste.



Instructions

1. Decide which adults to interview, choosing people who will be interested in food waste in your school. You could include:
 - the school cooks
 - the lunchtime supervisors
 - the headteacher
2. Write a note to each adult explaining why you would like to interview them, and ask them to suggest a time that would be convenient for them to talk.
3. Decide who is going to interview each adult. You might also want to decide who is going to ask each question and who is going to record the answers.
4. If you have time, you could start the interview by explaining what you have already found out about food waste from your surveys.

Enjoy the interviews - this is a great opportunity to talk to important adults in your school and find out their views and ideas.
